Year in Review

The 2018 season brought many challenges. There was no shortage of hot humid weather and feast or famine type rainfall amounts. 2018 was the hottest year on record. Hot, humid conditions combined with heavy rains at various times presented many obstacles for turf and other plant material. These conditions lend themselves toward abnormal spikes in crabgrass germination and

allow other pests and diseases to have banner years. We will be taking a new approach to help combat crabgrass this year by splitting our application of pre-emergent herbicide. We feel this will lead to better control and a superior outcome. One of the biggest challenges from last season was dealing with an abnormally high population of chinch bugs. Hot weather through the summer months allowed these insects to thrive. As far as chinch bugs are concerned, communication is key. Gypsy moth continues to be a challenging problem in New England. The brown spots you may be seeing on trees are the moth's egg casings. If you notice this activity, please schedule a consultation with us so we can provide an estimate for treatment options.

Please remember with a 6-8-week window between treatments we may not always catch a problem at its onset, and we are always willing to come to take a second look upon your request and work through these issues with you.

Frequently Asked... I have an irrigation system; why is my lawn still so dry?!?

It is important to keep in mind that irrigation systems are meant to supplement the natural rainfall we get each year. If we are in a drought condition, an irrigation system alone may not provide enough water to keep turf and plant material sufficiently watered. A helpful tip is to water deep and infrequently. Provide enough water to soak the root zone and then allow time for the root zone to dry which will encourage roots to grow deeper in search of water. Yearly Core Aeration helps build roots as well. Add our drought buster application in June which can help with water penetration deeper into the root zone. We have had great success with this treatment for the last 3 seasons. Please call the office for this once a year treatment.
